

Monthly Current Affairs for TNPSC

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The United Nations General Assembly has designated November 25 as the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women (Resolution) 134/54) The premise of the day is to raise awareness around the world that women are subjected to rape, domestic violence and other forms of violence; furthermore, one of the aims of the day is to highlight that the scale and true nature of the issue is often hidden. For 2014, the official theme framed by the UN Secretary-General's campaign UNITE to End Violence against Women, is Orange your Neighbourhood. For 2018, the official theme is "Orange the World: HearMeToo", for 2019 it is "Orange the World: Generation Equality Stands Against Rape", for 2020 it is "Orange the World: Fund, Respond, Prevent, Collect!" and for 2021 it is "Orange the World: End Violence against Women Now!".

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Indian crested porcupine

 A male tiger was recently found dead at Kazhudhakatti stream in the Tirupur forest division located in Tamil Nadu due to injuries sustained in a fight with a porcupine.

About

- The Indian crested porcupine is a large rodent, weighing 11–18 kg. Their body (from the nose to the base of the tail) measures between 70–90 cm, with the tail adding an additional 8–10 cm.
- Indian crested porcupines have a very broad and mostly herbivorous diet. Indian crested porcupines have a very broad and mostly herbivorous diet.
- They consume a variety of natural and agricultural plant material, including roots, bulbs, fruits, grains, drupe and tubers, along with insects and small vertebrates.

Talagirishwara temple

 Neglect has taken a heavy toll on the 1,300-yearold Pallava period paintings at Talagirishwara temple at Panamalai in Villupuram district of Tamil Nadu.

About

- It is located in Panamalai village of Viluppuram district in Tamil Nadu, India.
- The temple is constructed on an insignificant, small hill overlooking the Panamalai Lake.
- The temple was constructed by Pallava king Narasimhavarman II, popularly known as Rajasimha.

Features

- This Seventh Century structure incorporates a Vimana that resembles that of Kailasanatha temple in Kanchipuram.
- The garbhagriha stocks a Dharalingam, and as in Pallava temples of that period, there is a Somaskanda section on hindmost wall of the shrine.

- It includes an Ardhamandapam (partial Mandapam).
- The paintings in this temple bear a close resemblance to the paintings in Ajantha and Chithannavasal.
- The paintings are on the wall of a sub-temple on the northern side of the Talagirishwara (Siva) temple.
- There is a painting of Lord Shiva with eight hands dancing known as Latathilagabhani, being watched by Goddess Parvathi with her crown and well decorated umbrella.
- These paintings were older than Chithannavasal paintings.
- These paintings were created after covering the stonewalls with paste made of limestone and sand.

Point Calimere Wildlife sanctuary

 News- The forest department of Tamil Nadu is preparing to augment water bodies to attract more birds as the migratory season at Point Calimere Wildlife and Bird Sanctuary is set to peak.

About

- Point Calimere Wildlife Sanctuary was established in the year 1967 and is situated in the state of Tamil Nadu.
- It houses the famous bird sanctuary of Vedaranyam and the Talaignayar forests.
- It is flanked by the Bay of Bengal in the east and Palk Strait in the south.
- It primarily focuses on the protection and conservation of the black antelopes, an endangered and endemic species that are found in this region.
- It is designated as a Ramsar site.
- Rare bioluminescent mushroom found in the Kanyakumari Wildlife Sanctuary
- A team of researchers and the forest department

have found a rare bioluminescent mushroom in the Kanyakumari Wildlife Sanctuary (KKWLS).

New Pamban Bridge

 The new Pamban Bridge is likely to be inaugurated by the Prime Minister in a few months.

About

- It is India's first vertical-lift railway sea bridge.
- It connects Rameswaram on Pamban Island to Mandapam on the mainland in Tamil Nadu.
- Bridge Length:
- The total length of the bridge is 2.07 km.
- It will have 99 spans with 18.3-meter-long girders. The navigational span will be 63 metres.
- It will replace the iconic Pamban Bridge, India's first sea bridge, which opened in 1914.
- The new bridge is being built parallel to the old Pamban Bridge by Rail Vikas Nigam Limited.



New plant species found at Kanyakumari wildlife sanctuary

 News- A team of scientists from the Botanical Survey of India (BSI) have reported the discovery of two new plant species from the evergreen forest patches at the southern end of the Western Ghats.

About

 The new species Musseanda conferta and Rungia longistachya were discovered during recent explorations by BSI scientists.

Musseanda conferta

• It was discovered in the rocky areas of Kanyakumari Wildlife Sanctuary and is related to the Musseanda hirsutisima family.

- It prefers the vicinity of rocks in the highaltitude grassland ecosystems.
- It has attractive flowers, and the ornamental potential of this plant can be explored.

Rungia longistachya

- It belongs to the family Acanthaceae.
- It was discovered from the moist places of the Anamalai region near the Idukki dam site in Kerala.
- The plant is an herb and grows on the margins of evergreen forests.
- Only eleven species of Rungia have been reported from the Western Ghats, and the newly discovered plant has a distinct, narrow, long spike with a long slender peduncle and light pinkish-white flowers.

Constantine Joseph Beschi

 The English translation of the first biography of Constantine Joseph Beschi (known as Veeramamunivar) in Tamil written by A. Muttusami Pillei was released.

About

- He was an Italian Jesuit missionary and Tamil scholar.
- He was known as Veeramamuniyar.
- He arrived in Goa in 1700
- He also studied Sanskrit, Telugu, and Tamil assiduously and became a master of these languages, especially Tamil.
- His works: Thembavani, Sathurakarathi, and others, speak for his scholarship in Tamil. He was known as Thairiyanathaswamy, and its translation reads Veeramamunivar.

Al-Powered Elephant Protection System

 News- With efforts to prevent elephant deaths on railway tracks connecting the state with Kerala in the Madukkarai forest range in Coimbatore proving to be "inadequate", Tamil Nadu has now turned to an artificial intelligence-based system that will use the thermal and normal cameras to help detect the movement of the jumbos near the tracks.



Neolithic Art

 News- A rock art dating back to the Neolithic period was found in the Palnadu district of Andhra Pradesh.

About

- The Neolithic Age, also called the New Stone Age, is the final stage of cultural evolution or technological development among prehistoric humans
- The term Neolithic is most frequently used in connection with agriculture, which is the time when cereal cultivation and animal domestication were introduced.
- In India, the starting point of the Neolithic is generally thought to have occurred sometime around 7000 BCE.
- The Neolithic followed the Mesolithic Period and preceded the Chalcolithic Age, or the early period of metal tools.
- Features of the Neolithic Age:
- It was characterised by stone tools shaped by polishing or grinding, dependence on domesticated plants or animals, settlement in permanent villages, and the appearance of such crafts as pottery and weaving.
- The houses were built of mud and reed in rectangular or circular shapes.
- Some of the important Neolithic sites in India include Burzahom in Kashmir, Chirand in Bihar and Edakkal caves in Kerala.

Pichwai Painting

 Recently, artists in Chennai hosted an art exhibit showcasing Pichwai, some dating back 350 years.

About

- It is a traditional style of painting that originated in the state of Rajasthan, India.
- The history of this art form can be traced back to the 17th century.

- It is believed to have originated in the town of Nathdwara in Rajasthan.
- Theme: It mainly features the various stages of Lord Krishna's life.
- Material used: The artists use stone pigments, especially for gold and silver tones. The brighter orange, red, chrome yellow and kesari colours come from vegetable dyes
- Other schools of Pichwai— Nathdwara, Kishangarh and Bundi in Rajasthan.
- They are often used to decorate the backdrops of Hindu temples, where they serve as a visual representation of the stories associated with Lord Krishna.

Cardamom Cultivation


 News- The timely setting in of the North-East monsoon in high-ranges has brought smiles to the faces of cardamom growers in India.

About

- It is popularly known as Queen of Spices and belongs to the Zingiberaceae family.
- It is native to the evergreen, rainy forests of Western Ghats in South India.
- It is cultivated mainly in the Southern states, viz., Kerala, Karnataka, and Tamil Nadu.
- Soil and climate
- Soil: It is grown in forest loamy soils, which are usually acidic in nature with a pH range of 5.0–6.5.
- This crop can be grown at an elevation from 600 to 1500 m.
- Temperature: 10 to 35 degree C
- Rainfall: 1500 to 4000 mm
- The growth of cardamom is enhanced when planted in humus rich soils with low to medium available phosphorous and medium to high available potassium.
- It is used as a flavouring agent and drug in traditional medicine.

Pradhan Mantri-Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PM-PVTG) Development Mission

 News- The Prime Minister will launch the PM-PVTG Development Mission in a bid to empower the tribals on the birth anniversary of Birsa Munda, which has been celebrated as



About the Scheme

- The Rs 24,000-crore project is aimed at the development of the PVTGs.
- It has been designed to bring critical infrastructure like power, water, road connectivity, housing, education, and healthcare to the PVTG communities living in remote villages.
- Under the scheme, about 11 interventions like the PM-Gram Sadak Yojana, PM-Gram Awaas Yojana, Jal Jeevan Mission, and others will be taken to these target villages through the coordinated work of nine ministries.
- In addition, saturation will be ensured for schemes such as the Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojna, Sickle Cell Disease Elimination, TB Elimination, 100 percent immunisation, PM Surakshit Matritva Yojana, PM Matru Vandana Yojana, PM Poshan, and PM Jan Dhan Yojana.

Note

• PVTGs are a more vulnerable group among tribal groups in India.

- These groups have primitive traits, geographical isolation, low literacy, zero to negative population growth rate and backwardness.
- Moreover, they are largely dependent on hunting for food and a pre-agriculture level of technology.
- In 1973, the Dhebar Commission set up a separate category for Primitive Tribal Groups (PTGs). In 1975, the Centre identified 52 tribal groups as PTGs. In 1993, 23 more groups were added to the list. Later, in 2006, these groups were named PVTGs.
- Currently, there are 2.8 million PVTGs belonging to 75 tribes across 22,544 villages in 220 districts across 18 states and Union Territories in India.

India International Sci<mark>e</mark>nce Festival

• News- The 9th edition of the India International Science Festival (IISF) 2023 will be held at Faridabad, Haryana from January 17th-20th, 2024.

About

- It will be held at the Campus of Translational Health Science and Technology Institute (THSTI) and Regional Centre for Biotechnology (RCB) of the Department of Biotechnology in Faridabad.
- Theme: 'Science and Technology Public Outreach in Amrit Kaal'.
- IISF 2023 aims to provide a platform for inspiring the public at large and individuals with diverse levels of interests, like students, educators, scientists, researchers, industry professionals, entrepreneurs, and science communicators.

National Health Claim Exchange (NHCX)

 News- The National Health Authority (NHA) and the Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) have joined hands to operationalize the National Health Claim Exchange (NHCX).

About

• It is a digital health claims platform developed by the National Health Authority.

- It will serve as a gateway for exchanging claims-related information among various stakeholders in the healthcare and health insurance ecosystem.
- It is designed to be interoperable, machinereadable, auditable and verifiable, as well as help ensure the information exchanged is accurate and trustworthy.

Overall tiger population increased 60%

 News- As per the report submitted under the Global Tiger Recovery Program (GTRP) 2.0 overall tiger population increased 60%.

About

- Global Tiger Recovery Program (GTRP):
- It was launched in 2010 under the Global Tiger Initiative (GTI) by the World Bank to save wild tigers.
- This initiative set up the ambitious target of reversing the rapid decline of wild tigers across their range and doubling their population numbers by 2022.





Indo-Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity (IPEF)

 News- The Indo-Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity (IPEF) recently signed an agreement to strengthen its supply chain and ensure adherence to labour rules.

About

- It is a regional arrangement to build cooperation and economic integration in the Indo-Pacific region.
- It was launched by United States President Joe Biden on May 23, 2022.
- This framework is intended to advance resilience, sustainability, inclusiveness, economic growth, fairness, and competitiveness for member economies.
- IPEF will seek to complement and build on existing regional architecture and support the global rules-based trading system.
- It currently includes 14 partner countries: Australia, Brunei Darussalam, Fiji, India, Indonesia, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Malaysia, New Zealand, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, the United States, and Vietnam.

- The economic framework broadly rests on four pillars:
 - Trade
 - Supply chain resilience
 - Clean Energy, Decarbonization, and Infrastructure
 - Taxes and anti-corruption measures


Igla-S

 News- Russia recently signed a contract to supply Igla-S hand-held anti-aircraft missiles to India

About

- It is a man-portable air defence system (MANPADS) developed by Russia.
- It is known in the West as SA-24 Grinch.
- It entered service with the Russian Army in 2004.
- It can be fired by an individual or crew to bring down an enemy aircraft.
- It has the capability of bringing down low-flying aircraft. It can also identify and neutralise air targets, such as cruise missiles and drones.





Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana-Accelerated Irrigation Benefit Programme (PMKSY-AIBP



News

• The government of India approved the inclusion of the Jamrani Dam Multipurpose Project under the Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana-Accelerated Irrigation Benefit Programme (PMKSY-AIBP).

Note

• The project envisages the construction of a dam near Jamrani village across river Gola, a tributary of river **Ram Ganga**, in the Nainital district of Uttarakhand.

About the scheme

- It was launched in 2015-16.
- Aim: To enhance physical access to water on farms, expand cultivable areas under assured irrigation, improve on-farm water use efficiency, and introduce sustainable water conservation practices.

Components

- Accelerated Irrigation Benefit Programme (AIBP): To focus on faster completion of ongoing Major and Medium Irrigation including National Projects.
- Har Khet Ko Pani (HKKP): It consists of four sub-components, being Command Area Development & Water Management (CAD&WM), Surface Minor Irrigation (SMI), Repair, Renovation and Restoration (RRR)

- of Water Bodies, and Ground Water (GW) Development component.
- Other components
- Per Drop More Crop(PDMC): It is being implemented by the Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare.
- The Watershed Development component (WDC): It is being implemented by the Department of Land Resources.
- Nodal Ministry: Department of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare.

PM Kisan Bhai

News

To help small and marginal farmers, who do not have capacity to hold their produce in warehouses and wait for better prices, the Centre plans to incentivise them under a scheme likely to be named PM-Kisan Bhai (Bhandaran Incentive) scheme.

 The scheme is likely to be rolled out by December-end.

Pradhan Mantri Kisan samman Nidhi

 News- Prime Minister Narendra Modi disbursed the 15th instalment of the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-Kisan) scheme

About

- The PM-KISAN scheme, a flagship initiative of the government, aims to provide financial assistance to all landholding farmers across the country.
- Under this program, eligible farming families receive Rs. 6000 annually, distributed in three equal installments of Rs. 2000 every four months, to support their agricultural and domestic needs. However, the recent installment seems to be pending for some beneficiaries, prompting the need for a solution.







Alcalus fontinalis

 Researchers recently discovered a new species of frog named Alcalus fontinalis in the northeast Indian state of Arunachal Pradesh.

About

- It is a newly discovered species of frog.
- It was discovered in the Namdapha Tiger Reserve, Arunachal Pradesh.
- The frog appeared to be a mix of a bush frog and a water frog.



New species of wasp

• News- Scientists of the Zoological Survey of India (ZSI) recently discovered a new species of wasp named 'Taeniogonalos dhritiae' in the Western Ghats of Kerala.

Gudavi Bird Sanctuary

 News- The sudden deaths of several birds at Gudavi Bird Sanctuary in Shivamogga district of Karnataka has left the officers of the Forest Department in worry.

About the Bird Sanctuary

- It is one of the renowned Bird Sanctuaries in Karnataka.
- It is located on Gudavi Lake banks.

- It is engulfed with natural beauty and rich biodiversity, attracting tourists from different parts of the world.
- Fauna: The Bird Sanctuary prides itself on being the home of more than 217 bird species, including residential and migratory birds like Grey Heron, Little Cormorant, Little Grebe, White Ibis and White-Headed Crane.
- Flora: It is covered by moist deciduous forest species interspersed with grassy patches.
- This wetland vegetation comprises marshy plants, and microphyte biota.

Global Declaration for River Dolphins

News

 In a ground-breaking development, 11 Asian and South American countries recently signed a global declaration, the "Global Declaration for River Dolphins," aimed at preserving the world's six remaining river dolphin species.

About

- This declaration is designed to guide 14 nations where river dolphins inhabit, with a focus on responsible freshwater dolphin conservation.
- It aims to halt the decline of all river dolphin species and increase the most vulnerable populations.
- The declaration will escalate collaborative endeavours to safeguard the surviving river dolphin species.
- Countries that adopted the declaration include Bangladesh, Bolivia, Brazil, Cambodia, Colombia, Ecuador, India, Nepal, Pakistan, Peru, and Venezuela.

River Dolphins

 River dolphins are any of six species of small, usually freshwater aquatic mammals that are related to whales (Order Cetacea).

- A seventh river dolphin species, the Chinese river dolphin, or baiji, was declared extinct in 2007.
- Distribution: These dolphins are found in rivers of south-central Asia, China, and South America and in the coastal waters of Brazil, Argentina, and Uruguay.
- Common Features: They have slender beaks lined with lots of teeth, small eyes, flexible necks and bodies, pronounced forehead melons, large flippers, and small dorsal fins.
- The six surviving species of river dolphins are the Amazon, Indus, Ganges, Irrawaddy, Tucuxi, and Yangtze finless porpoises.
- All six species of river dolphins are classified as Endangered or Critically Endangered on the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species.
- The largest is the Amazon River dolphin (Inia geoffrensis).

New Gecko species

 News- A team of scientists and researchers have discovered a new species of gecko endemic to Mizoram.

About

 The new species has been named 'Cyrtodactylus vairengtensis' after the town in Mizoram where it was found.

- The common name suggested for the new species is 'Vairengte bent-toed gecko'.
- The distinct feature of this new species is the number of femoral pores which distinguishes it from other members of the Cyrtodactylus family.
- Femoral pores are located on the underside of the hind legs in lizards that secrete a mixture of lipids and proteins and are thought to be used to attract mates and mark territories.
- It is endemic to Mizoram, taking the number of geckos native to the state to 6, and 22 across northeast India.
- There are 335 gecko species across the world, of which 42 are found in India.

New crustacean parasites

 News- Research conducted at the University of Kerala has led to the unprecedented discovery of a new crustacean family off the Indian coast.

About

- Researchers have named the new family
- This is also the first discovery and description of a new crustacean family from India.
- These parasitic copepods are known to infest a wide range of hosts, from sponges to marine mammals.

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SCIENCE AND TECH





Vikram-1 rocket

 Indian firm Skyroot Aerospace recently unveiled its indigenously-built Vikram-1 rocket.

About

- Vikram-1, named after the father of India's space programme, Vikram Sarabhai, is a multistage launch vehicle with a capacity to place around 300 kg of payloads in low-earth orbit.
- It has been built by Hyderabad-based Skyroot Aerospace, a space startup.
- It is an all-carbon-fibre-bodied rocket that can place multiple satellites into orbit.
- Being a solid-fuel rocket and using relatively simpler technologies would mean that launching this vehicle would require minimal infrastructure and that the rocket could be assembled and launched within 24 hours from any site

Lorrainosaurus

 The fossils of a 170-million-year-old ancient marine reptile named 'Lorrainosaurus' from the Age of Dinosaurs have been recently identified as the oldest-known mega-predatory pliosaur.

About

- It is the oldest mega-predatory pliosaur.
- It lived during the ancient Middle Jurassic era in marine environments.
- The regions in which it lived 170 million years ago are now located in northern France.
- This giant reptile probably reached over 6 meters from snout to tail.
- The animal had jaws over 1.3 m long with large conical teeth and a bulky 'torpedo-shaped' body propelled by four flipper-like limbs.
- They were ecological equivalents of today's killer whales and would have eaten a range of prey, including squid-like cephalopods, large fish, and other marine reptiles.

Climate Services report 2023

 Recently, the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) released Climate Services report 2023.

About

- Less than 25 per cent of health ministries across the world utilise climate information and services to monitor health risks related to climate sensitivity.
- It highlights health protection as a priority in almost all countries and identifies the need for high-quality information for better decision making.
- While extreme heat causes the greatest mortality of all extreme weather, heat warning services are provided to health decision makers in only half of the affected countries;
- Climate change mitigation leading to reducing air pollution can save lives; and
- Investments to improve the capabilities of the health sector to safeguard the most vulnerable are insufficient.

Global Talent Competitiveness Index (GTCI), 2023

 News- The Global Talent Competitiveness Index has seen India fall sharply from rank 83 ten years ago to rank 103 in its latest report out recently.

About

- It measures how countries grow, attract, and retain talent.
- It is an annual benchmarking report published by the prestigious chain of business schools, INSEAD.
- It provides a unique resource for decisionmakers to understand the global talent competitiveness picture and develop strategies to boost their economies.

- The 10th edition of the report covers 134 countries around the world across all income groups.
- Singapore, Switzerland, and the United States are among the top three countries on the index.
- Denmark, the Netherlands, Finland, Norway, Australia, Sweden, and the United Kingdom make up the rest of the Top 10.
- India is ranked 103, the worst among that of the BRICS countries. China remains at the top of the BRICS group of countries at rank 40, Russia at 52, South Africa at 68 and Brazil at 69.

News

- The International Energy Agency released the World Energy Employment 2023 report.
- Global employment in the energy sector grew by 3.4 million over pre-pandemic levels to 67 million in 2022.
- "Clean energy sectors added 4.7 million jobs globally over the same period and stand at 35 million.
- Fossil fuel jobs recovered more slowly after layoffs in 2020 and remain around 1.3 million below pre-pandemic employment levels, at 32 million.
- Job growth in the clean energy as well as fossil fuel sectors remained positive in India

- compared to pre-pandemic levels of 2019.
- With this, the country saw the fourth-highest number of new clean energy jobs being created in the past three years.
- The report mentioned five major sectors of the energy industry that led to maximum job creation post-pandemic.

Global Unicorn Rankings

- India has secured the third position in Global Unicorn Rankings
- It achieved an impressive count of 72 unicorn companies.
- The cumulative valuation of these unicorns stands at a staggering \$195.75 billion, showcasing the country's growing prowess in the international startup ecosystem.


State Food Safety Index 2022-2023

 The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) recently released the State Food Safety Index (SFSI) 2022-2023, which assesses the performance of Indian states and union

- territories in ensuring food safety.
- This annual evaluation employs a dynamic benchmarking model to objectively measure food safety across all regions.
- 19 out of 20 large Indian states, including Maharashtra, Bihar, Gujarat, and Andhra Pradesh, experienced a decline in their 2022-2023 SFSI scores compared to 2019.

Mahabali Tug

• Indian Navy recently commissioned Mahabali Tug Shoft Shipyard Pvt. Ltd., Gujarat.

About

- It is a 25-ton Bollard Pull (BP) Tug.
- This vessel, a creation of Shoft Shipyard located in Bharuch, Gujarat, is one of three such tugs commissioned as part of a collaborative effort between the Ministry of Defence and the Shipyard.
- It has been constructed in accordance with the classification rules set forth by the Indian Register of Shipping (IRS).
- It will assume a crucial role in aiding naval ships and submarines during berthing and unberthing operations, as well as in navigating through confined waters.
- It is equipped to enhance firefighting capabilities for ships both alongside and at anchorage.
- It is also outfitted for limited Search and Rescue Operations.

- The missile was developed by the Bengaluru-based Aeronautical Development Establishment, a lab under India's Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO).
- It is capable of deep penetration into adversary territory to strike high-value targets with precision.

• The coastal security exercise 'Sagar Kavach' is set to unfold its strategic manoeuvres along the Kerala and Mahe coasts.

About

- The exercise, conducted semi-annually, is a collaborative effort with active participation from various central and state agencies, showcasing a unified approach to fortifying India's coastal defences.
- Coordinated by the Indian Coast Guard, 'Sagar Kavach' brings together an amalgamation of

- It seeks to create new strategies and assess operational capabilities in the context of modern warfare.


Exercise CORPAT and Bongosagar


 News- The government has started the process of constitution of the Sixteenth Finance Commission. The government has started the process of constitution of the Sixteenth Finance Commission.

About Finance Commission:

- It is a constitutional body for giving recommendations on the distribution of tax revenues between the Union and the States and amongst the States
- The Finance Commission is constituted by the President under Article 280 of the Constitution.
- It is constituted at the end of every fifth year or earlier, as deemed necessary by the President.
- Parliament may, by law, determine the requisite qualifications for appointment as members of the Commission and the procedure for their

selection. On account of this, The Finance Commission (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1951, was passed.
