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Vaishali become the third women chess Grandmaster in India

In this Indian name, the name Rameshbabu is a patronymic, and the person should be referred to by the given name, Vaishali.

Silver medal – second place Hangzhou Women's team

Rameshbabu Vaishali is an Indian chess grandmaster. She is the third woman in India to have achieved the grandmaster title, making her and her brother Praggnanandhaa the first-ever brother-sister duo to achieve the grandmaster title. They also became the first-ever brother-sister duo to qualify for the Candidates Tournament.

Vaishali was born in a Tamil family in Chennai. She is the elder sibling of Grandmaster R Praggnanandhaa. Her father, Rameshbabu, works at TNSC Bank as a branch manager. Her mother, Nagalakshmi, is a homemaker.

Vaishali's father, Rameshbabu, was an enthusiastic chess player and introduced her to the game when she was a young girl.

Vaishali won the Girls' World Youth Chess Championship for Under and Under-in she defeated future World Chess Champion Magnus Carlsen in a simul competition that Carlsen held while in her hometown of Chennai for the World Chess Championship

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Kazhuveli Bird Sanctuary

About

- It is located in the state of Tamil Nadu.

- It is listed as one of Tamil Nadu's 141 prioritized wetlands, Kazhuveli is also a wetland of international significance and a potential Ramsar site
- Kazhuveli has varied habitats including sloping wetlands preferred by shore birds, darters and waders, birds on floating vegetation and open grasslands preferred by different species of birds and fauna

Logistics Ease Across Different States

About

National Geoscience Data Repository (NGDR) Portal

• The Union Ministry of Mines is to launch the National Geoscience Data Repository (NGDR) Portal on 19th December 2023 in a ceremony in New Delhi.

About

- It is a comprehensive online platform for accessing, sharing, and analysing geospatial information across India.
- The NGDR initiative was spearheaded by the Geological Survey of India (GSI) and

Bhaskaracharya Institute of Space Applications and Geoinformatics (BISAG-N).

• It represents a significant leap forward in democratising critical geoscience data, empowering stakeholders across industries and academia with unprecedented access to invaluable resources

Article 356 of the Indian Constitution

• The Supreme Court recently held that the declaration of State emergency under Article 356 and the subsequent actions of the President should have a "reasonable nexus".

About

- Article 356 of the Constitution of India is based on Section 93 of the Government of India Act, 1935.
- According to Article 356, President's Rule can be imposed on any state of India on the grounds of the failure of the constitutional machinery.

This is of two types:

- If the President receives a report from the state's Governor or is otherwise convinced or satisfied that the state's situation is such that the state government cannot carry on the governance according to the provisions of the Constitution.
- Article 365: As per this Article, President's Rule can be imposed if any state fails to comply with all directions given by the Union on matters it is empowered to.

Article 370 of the Indian constitution

- The Supreme Court upheld the 2019 revocation of Jammu and Kashmir's special status under Article 370.
- It confirms that Jammu and Kashmir's integration with India, the court declared Article 370 temporary.



Climate club

• Climate Club was formally launched at the 28th Conference of Parties (COP28) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change.

About

- It is led by Germany and Chile, the Club has garnered support from 36 member countries including Kenya, the European Union, Switzerland and others.
- It aims to make decarbonisation of industries successful for climate and businesses, through ambitious policies, alignment of methodologies

and standards and improving finance and assistance for emerging and developed economies.

Group for Industry Transition

• India and Sweden launched Leadership Group for Industry Transition (LeadIT) 2.0 during the COP28 World Climate Action Summit, hosted in Dubai

• The MisrSat-2 project is originated from a 2019 agreement between the Egyptian Space Agency (EgSA) and the China National Space Administration.





CITIIS 2.0 Challenge

• The Union Minister of Housing & Urban Affairs and Petroleum & Natural Gas launched the CITIIS 2.0 Challenge.

About

- It is a program conceived by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) in partnership with the French Development Agency (AFD), Kreditanstalt für Wiederaufbau (KfW), the European Union (EU), and National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA).
- Objective:
- The program envisages supporting competitively selected projects promoting a circular economy with a focus on integrated waste management at the city level, climateoriented reform actions at the State level, and institutional strengthening and knowledge dissemination at the National level.

Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (PMMY)

• The Union Finance and Corporate Affairs Minister recently said women entrepreneurs are accorded first priority under the Centre's flagship Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana scheme.

About

- It is a flagship scheme of the Government of India to extend affordable credit to micro and small enterprises.
- Mudra schemes are designed to bring enterprises into the formal financial system or to "fund the unfunded".
- It enables a small borrower to borrow from all Public Sector Banks such as PSU Banks, Regional Rural Banks and Cooperative Banks, Private Sector Banks, Foreign Banks, Micro Finance Institutions (MFI), and Non Banking Finance Companies (NBFC) for loans upto Rs 10 lakhs for non-farm income-generating activities.

- Eligibility: Any Indian citizen who has a business plan for a non-farm sector incomegenerating activity such as manufacturing, processing, trading, or the service sector and whose credit need is less than Rs 10 lakh can approach either a bank, MFI, or NBFC for availing of Micro Units Development & Refinance Agency Ltd. (MUDRA) loans under PMMY.
- Types of loans provided: Under the aegis of PMMY, MUDRA has already created the following products
- Shishu: covering loans up to 50,000/-
- Kishor: covering loans above 50,000/- and up to 5 lakh
- Tarun: covering loans above 5 lakh and up to 10 lakh
- There is no subsidy for the loan given under PMMY. However, if the loan proposal is linked to some Government scheme wherein the Government is providing capital subsidies, it will also be eligible under PMMY.



Sophisticated Analytical & Technical Help Institutes (SATHI)

• The Centre's move to cancel a call for proposals under the Department of Science and Technology (DST)'s SATHI programme has sparked fears among higher education institutions.

About

• It is an initiative by the Department of Science and Technology to boost access to research and testing facilities and address problems of accessibility, maintenance, redundancy, and duplication of expensive equipment in Institutions.

• It aims to set up a shared, professionally managed Science and Technology (S&T) infrastructure facility which can be readily accessible to academia, start-ups, manufacturing units, industries, and R&D labs.

Pradhan Mantri Schools for Rising India (PM SHRI) scheme

• The Union Education Minister recently launched the Pradhan Mantri Schools for Rising India (PM SHRI) scheme in Odisha.

About

- It is a centrally sponsored scheme by the Government of India, announced in 2022.
- Objective:
- Development of more than 14,500 schools across the country by strengthening the existing schools among those managed by the Central Government/State/UT Government/ local bodies.
- It will nurture students in such a way that they become engaged, productive, and contributing citizens, building an equitable, inclusive, and plural society as envisaged by the National Education Policy 2020.

Amplifi 2.0 portal

• The Union Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs launched the Amplifi 2.0 portal.

About

- Amplifi (Assessment and Monitoring Platform for Liveable, Inclusive, and Future-Ready Urban India) portal aims to provide data on Indian cities.
- It is making raw data from Indian cities available on a single platform for academics, researchers, and stakeholders to help datadriven policymaking.
- Currently, 258 urban local bodies (ULB) have been on-boarded, and data for 150 cities is available on the portal.
- It provides data on a range of information for several cities, including, for example, the total diesel consumption and the number of samples tested for water quality.

PM Formalisation of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PMFME) Scheme

• The National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG) on behalf of River Cities Alliance (RCA), has signed a Memorandum of Common Purpose (MoCP) with the Mississippi River Cities and Towns Initiative (MRCTI), representing 124 cities/towns situated along the banks of the Mississippi River, USA

About

- It is a centrally sponsored scheme launched in 2020.
- Duration:
- The scheme is operational for a period of five years from 2020-21 to 2024-25 with an outlay of Rs. 10,000 Crore for supporting 2 lakh micro food processing enterprises.

Objectives:

- The objectives of scheme are to build capability of microenterprises to enable:
- Increased access to credit by existing micro food processing entrepreneurs, FPOs, Self Help Groups and Cooperatives;
- Integration with organized supply chain by strengthening branding & marketing;
- Support for transition of existing 2,00,000 enterprises into formal framework;
- Increased access to common services like common processing facility, laboratories, storage, packaging, marketing and incubation services;
- Strengthening of institutions, research and training in the food processing sector;
- Increased access for the enterprises, to professional and technical support.

About

- It is an initiative of the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India.
- It was conceptualized with the mission to spread awareness about cybercrime and build the capacities of Chief Information Security Officers (CISOs) and frontline IT officials across all government departments.
- It is an initiative to fortify the cyber security system in India with regard to the Government's vision of a Digital India.

NAMO Drone Didi scheme

• PM Modi's NAMO Drone Didi, unveiled on Nov 30, empowers 15,000 women Self Help Groups (SHGs) with agricultural drones, placing rural women at the forefront of the agri revolution





Nidirana noadihing- New frog species

- It is a new species of 'music frog' which is named Nidirana noadihing.
- The new frog of the genus Nidirana is phenotypically distinct from its congeners by a combination of morphological characters
- It is confirmed for the first time that the Nidirana genus has been found in India.
- The Nidirana species is known in Japan, Taiwan, China, Vietnam, Laos, and Thailand.
- Nidirana are known to inhabit swamps, ponds, and paddy fields, and they often construct nests to lay their eggs.

Dragon Snakehead Fish



• The Dragon Snakehead Fish (Aenigmachanna gollum) has been added to the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Red List, indicating potential conservation challenges.

About:

• The Dragon Snakehead Fish is colloquially

known as a 'living fossil' and is named after a character in Lord of the Rings.

- Primarily found in Kerala, India, it is considered a remarkable species that evolved around 120 million years ago, likely coexisting with dinosaurs in the Jurassic period.
- Due to its isolation in underground habitats, scientists believe that extinction events on land may not have significantly impacted its survival.
- Habitat: The Dragon Snakehead Fish is commonly found in wetlands and nearby paddy fields.

Saiga

• The Saiga (Saiga tatarica) species has seen a change in its conservation status from Critically Endangered to Near Threatened, as declared by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN).

About

• It is a large migratory herbivore.

Appearance:

- This antelope has an extremely unusual appearance with an oversized and flexible nose, the internal structure of which acts like a filter.
- Their large noses filter out dust kicked up by the herd in the warm summers and warms the icy air before it reaches their lungs in the winters.
- Habitat: Saigas inhabit open dry steppe grasslands and semi-arid deserts.
- Distribution: Saigas were widespread throughout the Eurasian Steppe, a vast grassland stretching from Hungary in Europe to Manchuria in Asia.
- Presently, they are found in fragmented populations within Kazakhstan, Mongolia, the Russian Federation, and Uzbekistan.

Indian Forest and Wood Certification Scheme

- The Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change has launched the Indian
- Forest & Wood Certification Scheme.

About

- This national forest certification scheme offers voluntary third-party certification designed to promote sustainable forest management and agroforestry in the country.
- The scheme includes forest management certification, tree outside forest management certification, and chain of custody certification.
- It can provide market incentives to various entities that adhere to responsible forest management and agroforestry practices in their operations.
- The Forest Management certification is based on the Indian Forest Management Standard, consisting of 8 criteria, 69 indicators and 254 verifiers, which is an integral part of the National Working Plan Code 2023, launched earlier this year.

Cinereous Vulture





• The Cinereous Vulture (Aegypius monachus), one of the largest raptors in the world, has been sighted at the Asola Bhatti Wildlife Sanctuary.

About

- It is also known as the Eurasian Black Vulture or monk vulture.
- It is one of the heaviest and largest raptors in the world.
- It is one of the two largest Old-World vultures.
- It is an altitudinal migrant which means it migrates from a higher to a lower altitude.

Habitat:

• This vulture is a bird of hilly, mountainous areas, especially favouring dry semi-open habitats such as meadows at high altitudes over much of the range.

Distribution:

- It is a Eurasian species. It is mainly found in Spain and inland Portugal, South France, central Asia, northern India, northern Manchuria, Mongolia and Korea.
- Conservation status- IUCN: Near threatened.

Banni Grassland

• The Gujarat Government recently said that the Central Government has approved setting up a cheetah breeding and conservation centre in the Banni Grassland.

About

- It is located along the northern border of the Kachchh district in the State of Gujarat.
- It is one of the largest grasslands in the Indian subcontinent with an area of over 2500 sq.km.

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PACE Mission

• NASA is gearing up to enhance our understanding of Earth's atmosphere with the upcoming Plankton, Aerosol, Cloud, Ocean Ecosystem (PACE) mission, scheduled for launch in early 2024.

About

- The mission will employ advanced polarimeters to study the interplay of light, aerosols, and clouds, contributing to a deeper comprehension of their impact on air quality and climate.
- The PACE mission will not only analyze aerosols but also delve into studying the colour of the ocean.

Vyommitra

• India is set to launch Vyommitra, a female robot astronaut, into space as part of the ambitious Gaganyaan project.

About

- Vyommitra is a combination of two Sanskrit words Vyoma (Space) and Mitra (Friend).
- It is a female robot designed and developed by the ISRO to fly aboard unmanned test missions ahead of the Gaganyaan human spaceflight mission.
- It is referred to as a half-humanoid robot as she doesn't have legs. However, she can bend forward and sideways.



Scattered Spiders

• The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) recently issued a warning to organizations about a hacking group called Scattered Spiders.

About

- It is a hacking group notorious for invading various organizations across the world.
- This hacker group is known by other aliases as well, including Starfraud, UNC3944, Scatter Swine, and Muddled Libra.
- The members are as young as 16 years old and primary English speakers.
- They break into the IT environments of victims, exfiltrate as much valuable data as possible, and then demand payment to keep a lid on that information and not leak or sell it.

Presence of Hemoglobin in Epidermis



• Researchers discovered that hemoglobin, a protein found in red blood cells that binds oxygen, is also present in the epidermis.

About

- Epidermis
- It is the outermost layer of the skin and protects the body from the environment.
- The thickness of the epidermis varies in

different types of skin; it is only .05 mm thick on the eyelids and 1.5 mm thick on the palms and the soles of the feet.

- The epidermis layer itself is made up of five sub layers that work together to continually rebuild the surface of the skin:
- The various cells present in the epidermis are Keratinocytes, Melanocytes, Langerhans cells, and Merkel cells.

Tantalum

• A team of researchers from the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Ropar, found the presence of tantalum, a rare metal, in the Sutlej river sand in Punjab.

About

- It is a rare metal with the atomic number 73—the number of protons found in one atom of the element.
- The rare metal has been named after a Greek mythological figure, Tantalus.
- It's grey, heavy, very hard, and one of the most corrosion-resistant metals in use today.
- It possesses high corrosion resistance because, when exposed to air, it forms an oxide layer that is extremely difficult to remove, even when it interacts with strong and hot acid environments.

Southern Annular Mode

• The Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS) discovered that the Southern Annular Mode (SAM), an important climate pattern, plays a pivotal role in shaping sea conditions across the Indian Ocean.

About

- It is the north-south movement of Southern Westerly Winds over timescales of 10s to 100s of years.
- It is also known as the Antarctic Oscillation.
- They blow almost continuously in the mid- to high-latitudes of the southern hemisphere.
- It is usually defined as the difference in the zonal mean sea level pressure at 40°S (mid-latitudes) and 65°S (Antarctica).

Positive Southern Annular Mode

- In this mode, there is lower anomalous air pressure over Antarctica and higher anomalous air pressure over the mid-latitudes.
- The belt of strong westerly winds strengthens and contracts towards Antarctica.
- Negative Southern Annular Mode
- In this mode, the belt of strong Southern Westerly Winds expands northwards towards the equator, bringing cold, wet weather to Patagonia, glacier advance, and decreased Circumpolar Deep Water upwelling on the Antarctic Continental Shelf.

Noma disease

• The World Health Organization (WHO) announced the inclusion of noma (cancrum oris or gangrenous stomatitis) in its official list of neglected tropical diseases (NTDs).

About

- It is a rapidly progressing severe gangrenous disease of the mouth and the face.
- The disease, also called cancrum oris or gangrenous stomatitis, is mostly found in sub-Saharan Africa.
- It mostly affects children aged 2–6 years suffering from malnutrition, affected by infectious diseases, living in extreme poverty with poor oral health or with weakened immune systems.
- It can also occur among immune compromised adults due to HIV, leukaemia and other diseases.

Treatment:

- Early detection is essential, as therapy is most effective at the early stages of disease when it appears as aggressively swollen gums (acute necrotizing gingivitis).
- Treatment typically includes prescription of widely available antibiotics, advice and support on practices to improve oral hygiene, disinfectant mouthwash and nutrition supplements.

AMRIT Technology

• The Indian Institute of Technology, Madras

has developed a technology called 'AMRIT' (Arsenic and Metal Removal by Indian Technology) technology.

About

- It is developed for the removal of Arsenic and Metal ions from water.
- The technology uses nano-scale iron oxyhydroxide, which selectively removes arsenic when water is passed through it.
- This water purifier has been developed for both domestic as well as community levels.
- Also, the technology has been recommended by the erstwhile 'Standing Committee' of the Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation for the examination of the best technologies concerning water and sanitation.

Pompe disease

• India's first patient diagnosed with the Pompe disease died after spending nearly six years in a semi-comatose state.

About

• It is a rare inherited disorder that affects one child per million.

Causes:

- Mutations in the GAA gene cause Pompe disease.
- The GAA gene provides instructions for producing an enzyme called acid alpha-glucosidase (also known as acid maltase).
- This enzyme is active in lysosomes, which are structures that serve as recycling centres within cells.





Athlete of the Year for 2023

• Lionel Messi has been awarded with Time magazine's 2023 Athlete of the Year following his record eighth Ballon d'Or win, reaffirming his place among the greatest footballers in history.

World Billiards Championship



• Pankaj Advani won his 26th IBSF World Billiards Championship title in a remarkable comeback, defeating compatriot Sourav Kothari in the final.

Chess Grandmaster

• R. Vaishali, became only the third woman from India to get the Grandmaster (GM) title,

the highest a chess player could aspire for. Koneru Humpy was the first; she was, in fact, the world's youngest female player ever, when she became a GM in 2002, at the age of 15.

• The other Indian female GM is Dronavalli Harika. 22-year-old Vaishali completed the final requirement – 2,500 Elo points – during the ongoing Llobregat Open tournament in Spain.

ISSF World Cup Final



- Anish Bhanwala become the first Indian shooter to clinch a medal in the men's 25m Rapid Fire event at the ISSF World Cup Final.
- This surpassed the efforts of past Indian shooters like Vijay Kumar in 2009 and Gurpreet Singh in 2015, who had reached the final but fell short of claiming a medal.





Indira Gandhi Peace Prize



• The Indira Gandhi Prize for Peace, Disarmament, and Development 2022 was jointly awarded to the Indian Medical Association and the Trained Nurses Association of India as representatives of the COVID-19 warriors in the country

About

- Indira Gandhi Peace Prize:
- The Indira Gandhi Prize for Peace, Disarmament, and Development was instituted in the memory of the former prime minister by a trust in her name in 1986.
- It consists of a monetary award of 25 lakh rupees along with a citation.
- The award is given to individuals or organizations that work towards ensuring international peace and development, ensuring that scientific discoveries are used to further the scope of freedom and better humanity, and creating a new international economic order.

About

- It is awarded to inspirational, innovative and dedicated individuals or teams making a substantial and sustained impact within education.
- It celebrates individuals working in primary, secondary, further education, and higher education, encompassing teachers, technicians, and more.
- It recognizes a major national or international research or innovation contribution to the field of chemical science education.
- This prize was established to commemorate the life and work of Sir Ronald Nyholm, president of the Royal Society of Chemistry from 1968 to 1970.
- It is awarded annually.

Sahitya Akademi prize

• Tamil writer Devibharathi's novel Neervazhi Padooum, depicting the life of the Kudi Navithar, the community barbers in the Kongu region of Tamil Nadu, has won the Sahitya Akademi award for 2023. Neervazhi Padooum is a line from Purananuru poem, a Sangam age literary work.

Leif Erikson Lunar Prize



• The Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) has been awarded the prestigious Leif Erikson Lunar Prize by the Husavik Museum in recognition of the space agency's unwavering commitment and significant contributions to lunar exploration.

Vir Chakra

- INS Shivaji, Indian Navy's premier marine engineering training institute, has received the Vir Chakra medal awarded to Late Vice Admiral Benoy Roy Chowdhury, the only technical officer of the Indian Navy to be awarded the honour.
- The Vir Chakra is an Indian wartime military bravery award presented for acts of gallantry on the battlefield, on land or in air or at sea

- It also provides medium term projections of remittance flows to developing countries.

About

- It is published by Germanwatch, the New Climate Institute and the Climate Action Network annually.
- It was first time published in 2005.

Panchayat Development Index

• The Union Minister of State for Panchayati Raj briefed the Lok Sabha about the Panchayat Development Index.

About

- It is a multi-domain and multi-sectoral index that is intended to be used to assess the overall holistic development, performance & progress of panchayats.
- It incorporates various socio-economic indicators and parameters to gauge the well-being and development status of local communities within the jurisdiction of a panchayat.
- It would play a significant role for performance evaluation and progress assessment in achieving the localization of Sustainable Development Goals in rural area.

Global Drought Snapshot report

• The 'Global Drought Snapshot' report, launched by the UN Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD) at the outset of COP28 climate talks in the UAE, reveals that drought causes more economic losses and affects more sectors of societies.

About

- Originating from the 1992 Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro, the UNCCD is one of three conventions, the others being the conventions addressing climate change (UNFCCC) and biodiversity (UN CBD).
- It is the only legally binding framework set up to address desertification and the effects of drought.
- There are 197 Parties to the Convention, including 196 country Parties and the European Union.

Exercise Astrashakti 2023

• India has effectively showcased the capabilities

of its indigenous Akash surface-to-air (SAM) weapon system as part of its plans to export these systems.

About

- In the recent exercise Astrashakti 2023, a single unit of the Akash weapon system successfully engaged and obliterated four unmanned targets simultaneously.
- This demonstration established India as the first country to exhibit the ability to engage four targets at such distances simultaneously using command guidance from a single firing unit.
- It is a Short-Range Surface-to-Air Missile (SRSAM) Defence System to protect vulnerable areas and points from air attacks.
- It was indigenously designed and developed by the Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO).

INS Tarmugli

• INS Tarmugli, a Fast Attack Craft has been commissioned into the Navy

About

- It is the first Follow-on Water Jet Fast Attack Craft (WJFAC), is an improved version of WJFAC, earlier constructed by GRSE.
- It is built by M/s Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers Ltd (GRSE).
- It is conceived, designed and built indigenously.
- It would be deployed for coastal patrol and surveillance operations along the East Coast of India.
- It is named after a picturesque island in the Andaman group.

Barracuda Boat

• In a move towards eco-friendly maritime transportation, the Barracuda, India's fastest solar-electric boat, was ceremoniously launched at Alappuzha.

About

- It is named after the swift, long fish, Barracuda.
- It can be deployed even in the rough seas as a workboat to ferry up to 12 passengers and cargo.
- Features: This vessel can attain a top speed of 12.5 knots (23 kmph) and has a range of seven hours on a single charge.
- It has twin 50 kW electric motors, a marinegrade LFP battery, and 6 kW solar power, epitomizing efficient and clean energy usage.
- This cutting-edge vessel was jointly developed by Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders and Navalt.

Purchasing Managers' Index

• India's manufacturing sector continued to perform better with S&P Global Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) rising to 56 in November against 55.5 in October.

About

- It is an indicator of business activity both in the manufacturing and services sectors.
- It is a survey-based measure that asks the respondents about changes in their perception of some key business variables from the month before.
- Calculated separately for the manufacturing and services sectors, a composite index is then constructed.
- There are two types of PMI Manufacturing PMI and Services PMI.



Decline in Agriculture's GDP

• The government data reveals a decline in India's agriculture GDP share from 35% in 1990-91 to 15% in 2022-23, attributed to the rapid growth of the industrial and service sectors during this period.





International Film Festival of India (IFFI)

- The 54th International Film Festival of India (IFFI) recently commenced with a grand opening ceremony at the Dr. Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Indoor Stadium in Panaji, Goa.
- It was founded in 1952 under the patronage of the first Indian Prime Minister, Jawaharlal Nehru, and was organized by the Films Division, Government of India.

International year of Camelids

• The United Nations recently declared 2024 the International Year of Camelids.

About:

- A Camelid refers to any of the even-toed ungulates of the family Camelidae, e.g., camels, llamas, alpacas, guanacos, and vicuñas.
- They are known for their remarkable adaptations to arid and high-altitude environments.
- These ungulates can be classified into two major groups: the Old World and the New World.
- The Old-World Camelids, found in northern Africa and central Asia, are the true camels, such as the dromedary camels (one-humped camel) and the Bactrian camels (two-humped camel), characterized by:
- Their humps on their backs
- The dulla, which is an organ found on the throat of male camels and is believed to be associated with the display of dominance among males and for attracting females.
- The South American Camelids (New World Camelids) include the modern llamas, alpacas, guanacos, and vicuñas. Wild populations of South American Camelids, such as vicuñas, inhabit the high-altitude regions of the Andes Mountains.

Lakadong turmeric

- Meghalaya's Lakadong turmeric has been awarded the Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
