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Khelo India Youth Games- 2023

Prime Minister inaugurated the Khelo India Youth Games and expressed the government's commitment to hosting the 2029 Youth Olympics and the 2036 Olympic Games in the country.

Tamil Nadu is hosting the sixth edition of the Khelo India Youth Games. This is the first time that Khelo India Youth Games are being held in South India.

The Games will be played across four cities of Tamil Nadu, namely Chennai, Madurai, Trichy and Coimbatore from 19th to 31st January 2024.

This edition of Khelo India Youth Games will see participation from over 5600 athletes with over 275 competitive events across 26 sports disciplines and 1 demo sport.

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Stalin inaugurates jallikattu stadium built at ₹63 cr



- Touted to be the first of its kind, the threetiered stadium is spread across 65 acres. Built at a cost of ₹63 crore, it has a seating capacity of 5,000. Tamil Nadu chief minister MK Stalin inaugurated a jallikattu stadium in Madurai where the sport is most famous.
- Touted to be the first of its kind, the threetiered stadium is spread across 65 acres. Built at a cost of ₹63 crore, it has a seating capacity of 5,000. The stadium also has an air-conditioned space that can seat 50 people. A veterinary dispensary and an emergency centre have been set up for treatment of injured bulls and tamers. Ten emergency vehicles will be stationed outside the stadium during the competitions.
- "This is the first such stadium for jallikattu in the world," Stalin said at the event. Stalin named the stadium at Keelakarai village after his father and five time chief minister Late M Karunanidhi as the Kalaignar Centenary Eru Thazuvuthal Arangam and unveiled his statue.
- In classic Sangam literature, Eru Thazuvuthal means embracing the bull. "For the sport steeped in Tamil culture, Eru Thazuvuthal, the DMK government has built this glorious stadium," Stalin said. "I'm proud that history will have a space to say that Stalin built this for centuries old-Eru Thazhuvuthal," he added. The construction of the stadium was announced in 2022 in the state assembly.
- Jallikattu was temporarily banned in Tamil Nadu from 2014 to 2016 following a Supreme

Court order. Following massive protests against the ban in 2017, the state enacted the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (Tamil Nadu Amendment) Act of 2017 and the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (Conduct of Jallikattu) Rules of 2017 to override the ban. Expelled AIADMK leader, O Panneerselvam, had brought the ordinance when he was the chief minister in 2017.

Senna spectabilis

• The Forest Department of Tamil Nadu has cleared 356.50 hectares of invasive growth of Senna spectabilis that posed a threat to biodiversity conservation in Sathyamangalam Tiger Reserve (STR).



About

- It is a species of the legume family.
- It is native to South and Central America and is grown as an ornamental plant as it has bright yellow flowers.
- It was introduced as shade trees for coffee and firewood in the country; it soon became a threat to native tree species as its dense foliage prevented the growth of other indigenous trees and grass species.
- It is considered as Least Concern under the IUCN Red List.

Cauvery basin

• The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has served notices to Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and Kerala governments, based on a report by the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) that has highlighted the massive reduction of green cover in the Cauvery basin over the past five decades.



Bhoomi Rashi Portal.

• The Union Minister of Road Transport and Highways recently said 1467 projects of the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) have been brought under the Bhoomi Rashi Portal.

About

- It is an e-Governance initiative of the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways.
- The portal intends to expedite the process of land acquisition for National Highways.
- It acts as a single-point platform for the online processing of land acquisition notifications to accelerate highway infrastructure development projects in India.

Paat-Mitro

• The Ministry of Textiles recently launched the "Paat-Mitro" mobile application to provide important information about MSP and agronomy to jute farmers.

About

- It is a mobile application developed by the Jute Corporation of India Limited (JCI).
- Purpose: To provide important information about Minimum Support Prices (MSP) and agronomy to jute farmers.

Features:

- It is available in six languages.
- All the functionalities are made available to the users free of cost.

Ayodhya Ram Temple

• The Ram temple in Ayodhya is inaugurated on January 22. The complex is in the Nagara style of temple architecture, designed by 81-year-old Chandrakant Sompura and his 51-year-old son Ashish.



Socialist Icon and Former Bihar CM Karpoori Thakur Posthumously Awarded Bharat Ratna

• Former Bihar chief minister Karpoori Thakur was posthumously awarded the Bharat Ratna, which is India's highest civilian honour, by the president, press secretary to the president Ajay Kumar Singh said on (January 23). Thakur's birth anniversary falls on January 24..



• As chief minister of Bihar, he announced reservations for socially and economically backward groups, the extremely backward classes, educated women and poor women in 1978.

Backward caste leader

• Thakur (1924-1988) emerged as Bihar's tallest backward caste leader despite being from the nai (barber) community. He paved the way for the rise of other influential OBC politicians who eventually overtook his mantle. Though his tenures were short, Thakur left an outstanding legacy through his progressive decisions.

Participation in freedom struggle

• A staunch nationalist, Thakur had participated in India's independence movement and courted imprisonment. Post-1947, he enjoyed a long stint as MLA barring one term and served as education minister before becoming chief minister twice in the 1970s.



Asian Buddhist Conference for Peace (ABCP)

• The Indian Vice President recently inaugurated the 12th General Assembly of the Asian Buddhist Conference for Peace in New Delhi.

About

- It was founded in 1970 in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia, as a voluntary movement of followers of Buddhism with both monastic (monks) and lay members.
- Its aim is to bring together the efforts of Buddhists in support of consolidating universal peace, harmony, and cooperation among people in Asia.
- It is currently headquartered at the Ganden Tegchenling Monastery in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia, and the Supreme Head of Mongolian Buddhists is the ABCP President.

Snow Leopards

• Kyrgyzstan has officially designated the snow leopard as its national symbol, showcasing a strong dedication to conservation and maintaining ecological harmony.



Argentina Rejects BRICS Membership

• President Javier Milei has formally declined Argentina's membership in BRICS, citing it as

inappropriate at this time. In letters to BRICS leaders, he emphasized a departure.

Governing Council of UNIDROIT

• Ms. Uma Sekhar secured 45 out of 59 votes in the initial round of elections for the Governing Council of the International Institute for the Unification of Private Law (UNIDROIT) held in Rome, Italy.

Non-Aligned Movement (NAM)

• The 19th Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) summit was held in Kampala, the capital of Uganda on 19 and 20 January

About

- The 19th NAM Summit was held under Uganda's leadership in Kampala. Uganda has taken over as chair from Azerbaijan, to run until 2027.
- Theme: 'Deepening Cooperation for Shared Global Affluence.'
- The Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) is an alliance of developing nations that refuses to identify with any major superpower.
- It was established in 1961 at the height of the Cold War. Whereas it started with the Bandung Conference held in Indonesia in 1955.

Current members:

- 120 countries: 53 from Africa, 39 from Asia, 26 from Latin America and the Caribbean and two from Europe.
- It also includes the non-UN member state of Palestine, 17 other observer countries, and 10 observer organizations.
- India is one of the founding members.



RAMP Programme

• The Union Minister for Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (MSME) launched three sub-schemes under the aegis of the RAMP programme.

About

- The Raising & Accelerating MSME Performance (RAMP) programme is assisted by the World Bank.
- It aims to improve the performance of micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs) in India.
- It was launched in 2022.

Objectives:

- Improving access to market and credit for MSMEs
- Strengthening institutions and governance at the central and state levels
- Enhance centre-state linkages and partnerships
- Addressing issues of delayed payments
- Promote the greening of MSMEs

PM-AJAY Scheme

• The Minister of State for Social Justice and Empowerment informed the Rajya Sabha about the PM-AJAY scheme.



About

• Pradhan Mantri Anusuchit Jaati Abhyuday

Yojana (PM- AJAY) is a 100% Centrally Sponsored Scheme.

• It is a merged scheme of three Centrally Sponsored Schemes, namely Pradhan Mantri Adarsh Gram Yojana(PMAGY), Special Central Assistance to Scheduled Castes Sub Plan (SCA to SCSP), and Babu Jagjivan Ram Chhatrawas Yojana (BJRCY).

Objectives:

- The main objective of the scheme is to increase the income of the target population by way of various income generating schemes, skill development and infrastructure development.
- Reduce poverty among the target population and elevate them above the poverty line

Project PRAYAS

• Recently, the International Organisation for Migration (IOM) launched Project PRAYAS to help Indian workers and students migrate in a secure, orderly, and regular manner.

About

- Promoting Regular Assisted Migration for Youth and Skilled Professionals (PRAYAS) was launched in partnership with the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA).
- It is one of the first attempts to consolidate all the state-level initiatives for safe, orderly, and well-managed international migration.
- Goal: To facilitate safe, orderly, and regular migration for aspiring Indian migrant workers and students through policy recommendations in collaboration with the MEA and state governments, thus strengthening international migration governance.
- Undertake a study, capturing the key migration trends, the needs and aspirations of migrants, and the major international migration and mobility initiatives taken by the union, as well as the state governments sharing the analysis with the ministry.

National Programme on Anganwadi-cum-Creches

• The Union Minister of Women and Child Development inaugurated the National Programme on Anganwadi-cum-Creches in New Delhi.

About

- The Anganwadi-Cum-Creche initiative under the Palna Scheme underwent revisions and was included as part of the Samarthya subcomponent of Mission Shakti, starting from April 2022.
- The central aim of Anganwadi-cum- Creches is to meet the demand for quality childcare facilities and enable women to actively participate in the workforce.
- The Government of India aims to set up 17,000 creches across the country.

About Palna Scheme:

• The erstwhile National Creche Scheme has been reorganised and renamed as Palna Scheme under the sub scheme 'Samarthya' of 'Mission Shakti'.

Objectives

- Provide day-care facilities for children (6 months to 6 years) of working mothers in the community.
- Improve nutrition and health status of children.
- Promote physical, cognitive, social and emotional development (Holistic Development) of children.
- Educate and empower parents /caregivers for better childcare.

MedTech Mitra portal

• The Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare launched the MedTech Mitra portal.

About

- It is an online portal that aims to assist medtech innovators in clinical evaluation, regulatory facilitation, and uptake of new products.
- The portal will be coordinated collaboratively by the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and the Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation (CDSCO), under the

guidance of NITI Aayog's Atal Innovation Mission.

Mission Karmayogi

• News- On the occasion of Good Governance Day the Union Minister of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions launched the Extended Version of Mission Karmayogi, at a function in New Delhi.

About

- National Programme for Civil Services Capacity Building (NPCSCB) aims to prepare Civil Servants for the future by making them more creative, constructive & innovative through transparency and technology.
- This unique programme will help to lay the foundation for civil servants in the country.
- There will be more focus on 'on-site learning' in complementing "off-site learning".

Zero Defect Zero Effect (ZED) Scheme

• Zero Defect Zero Effect (ZED) scheme by the MSME Ministry has achieved the 1 lakh certification milestone.

About

• Launched in October 2016 and revamped in April 2022, the ZED scheme offers certification for environmentally conscious manufacturing under three certification levels (gold, silver, and bronze) classified according to 20 performance-based parameters such as quality management, timely delivery, process control, waste management, etc.

The major objectives of the ZED Scheme are:

- To create proper awareness in MSMEs about ZED manufacturing and motivate them for the assessment of their enterprise for a ZED rating.
- To drive manufacturing with the adoption of Zero-Defect production processes without impacting the environment (Zero Effect).
- To encourage MSMEs to constantly upgrade their quality standards in products and processes.
- To support the "Make in India" campaign.

Scheme for Residential Education for Students in High Schools in Targeted Areas (SHRESHTA)

• The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) recently issued instructions for Residential Private Schools interested in joining SHRESHTA Scheme.

About

- The scheme aims to provide access to the best private residential schools for meritorious students from Scheduled Caste (SC) communities.
- It will provide scholarships to meritorious students from SC communities to study in private and NGO-run residential schools for Classes 9-12.
- The scheme is expected to provide admissions to around 3,000 students in Classes 9 and 11 each year.
- The core objectives of the scheme are to enhance the reach of the development initiatives of the government and fill in the gap in service-deprived SC dominant areas in the education sector.
- The scheme will collaborate with voluntary organisations to provide an environment that can help create conditions for socio-economic upliftment and the overall development of the SC communities.

e-SAKSHI Mobile Application

• The Minister of State (Independent Charge) of the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) launched the MPLADS e-SAKSHI Mobile Application

About

- It was launched for revised fund flow procedure under Members of Parliament Local Area Development Scheme (MPLAD) Scheme.
- It will bring forth a myriad of benefits, revolutionising the way Members of Parliament engage with and manage development projects in their constituencies.

- It offers convenience and accessibility, allowing MPs to propose, track, and oversee the projects at their fingertips.
- This real-time access enhances decisionmaking processes, enabling swift responses to emerging needs or issues.

One Vehicle, One FASTag' initiative

• The National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) has launched the 'One Vehicle, One FASTag' initiative.

About

- The National Highways Authority of India suggested tagging users to complete the Know Your Customer (KYC) process by the end of January 31 to avoid deactivation.
- The move aims to enhance the efficiency of the Electronic Toll Collection system and provide seamless movement at the Toll Plazas.
- The new arrangement Of 'One Vehicle, One FASTag' has also been introduced to discourage user behaviour of using single FASTag for multiple vehicles or linking multiple FASTags to a particular vehicle.
- The initiative had been taken after the recent reports of multiple FASTags being issued for a particular vehicle and FASTags being issued without KYC in violation of RBI's mandate.

PM-eBus Sewa Scheme

• The Union Housing and Urban Affairs Minister recently said that the Ministry has floated tenders for procuring buses under the PM-eBus Sewa scheme.

About

- Under the PM-eBus Sewa Scheme, 10,000 e-buses will be deployed across cities in the country.
- The scheme was introduced to give a push to the slow adoption of e-buses in public transport.



Ennore Creek

• Experts from the Wildlife Trust of India (WTI) and the Besant Memorial Animal Dispensary (BMAD) are planning to establish feeding stations for birds at the Ennore creek.

About

- Ennore creek is a backwater located in Thiruvallur District, Tamil Nadu.
- It is an arm of the Kosathalaiyar River.
- The Creek meets the Bay of Bengal at Mugathwara Kuppam, while the northern channel of the creek connects to the Pulicat Lake, the second largest brackish water lake in the country.
- For decades, this creek sustained the livelihoods of the residents in the surrounding villages and has been demarcated as CRZ IV (Water Body) in the coastal zone management plan by the Tamil Nadu State Coastal Zone Management Authority.
- The Ennore Creek, along with the Buckingham Canal and the rest of the Pulicat water system has vast importance for the local fisher folk.
- It nurtures a healthy aquatic ecosystem that was once famous for its rich biodiversity.

Afraflacilla Kerala

• A team of researchers from Kerala and Tamil Nadu have discovered two new species of jumping spiders that belong to the genus Afraflacilla.

About

- Specimens of Afraflacilla Kerala were spotted in Irinjalakuda and Kuttanad while Afraflacilla adavathurensis was discovered from Adavathur in Tiruchirappalli.
- Only three species belonging to the Afraflacilla genus had been hitherto discovered in the country.

Non-invasive formaldehyde sensor

• the Nanomaterials and Nanoelectronics Laboratory, Department of Physics, Guwahati University, Assam has developed a costeffective formalin sensor that can effectively detect the presence of formalin in adulterated fishes.

About- Formaldehyde

• It is a colourless, pungent gas that is used in a variety of industrial processes, including as a preservative in some foods, commonly found in fish in developing countries.

Caddisfly

- Researchers at Baba Ghulam Shah Badshah University recently discovered a novel species of Caddisfly, named Rhyacophila masudi sp. nov., in Jammu and Kashmir.
- Caddisflies are moth-like insects that are attracted to lights at night and live near lakes or rivers.
- Distribution: They are found worldwide, usually in freshwater habitats but sometimes in brackish and tidal waters.

Features:

- Adult caddisflies are commonly 3 to 15 millimetres in length.
- Generally dull brownish, adult caddisflies resemble moths, with hairy wings and long antennae, but caddisflies do not have the long syphoning mouthparts that butterflies and moths have.
- Caddisflies hold their wings tent-like over their bodies when they are not flying.
- Like stoneflies, mayflies, and dobsonflies, immature caddisflies are aquatic, living in streams and lakes.
- Caddisfly larvae look similar to the larvae of

mayflies, aquatic beetles, and other aquatic insects, but can usually be distinguished by the presence of a "case."

• They feed primarily on plant juices and flower nectar, though a few are predaceous.



Paramyrothecium indicum

• Scientists recently discovered a new species of fungus in Kerala, named 'Paramyrothecium indicum'.

About

- It is a new species of phytopathogenic fungus.
- Phytopathogens are parasites surviving on a plant host.
- Most of Paramyrothecium are phytopathogens.
- They are responsible for "serious plant diseases which might negatively affect crop productivity.
- Paramyrothecium leaf spots are a type of fungal disease that can affect a variety of plants.
- Some species of Paramyrothecium produce secondary metabolites with bio-herbicidal potentials and, therefore, may find application in controlling weeds.

New Coral Snake Species

• Researchers from Mizoram University's zoology department have discovered a new species of coral snake in Mizoram.

About

• It has been named Sinomicrurus gorei after British Indian doctor Gore.

- The reptile is locally known as 'Rulthihna' due to its striking resemblance to a Mizo traditional amber necklace called 'Thihna'.
- There are a total of nine species of Sinomicrurus coral snakes that have been discovered worldwide, and out of these, only one species called Sinomicrurus macclellandi is found in Northeast India.
- It has unique patterns and different scales, hemipenis, DNA, and skull.

Himalayan Wolf

• Himalayan Wolf has been assessed for the first time in the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN)'s Red List and categorised as 'Vulnerable'.

About

- The Himalayan Wolf (Canis lupus chanco), a prominent lupine predator found across the Himalayas.
- Also known as Tibetan wolves, these wolves live at altitudes of more than 4,000 meters and are genetically distinct from grey wolves..
- Living at such high altitudes, these wolves have genetically adapted themselves to live in low oxygen (hypoxic) conditions.



India's First Dark Sky Park

• The Pench Tiger Reserve in Maharashtra has been designated as India's first Dark Sky Park and the fifth in Asia, protecting the night sky and preventing light pollution.

About

• The Pench Tiger Reserve (PTR) in Maharashtra is India's first Dark Sky Park within a tiger reserve for earmarking areas around the park that restrict light pollution for stargazers to access pristine dark skies



X- ray bursts

• India's first multi-wavelength space-based observatory AstroSat has detected bright subsecond X-ray bursts from a new and unique neutron star with an ultrahigh magnetic field (magnetar).

About

- These bursts occur in low-mass X-ray binary systems where a neutron star and low-mass main sequence star are in orbit around one another.
- Due to their close proximity and the extreme gravity of the neutron star, the companion star overflows its roche-lobe and hydrogen is drawn into an accretion disk around the neutron star.
- The missile is being developed in multiple variants to meet specific requirements.
- The ASTRA Mk-I Weapon System, integrated with SU-30 Mk-I aircraft, is being inducted into the Indian Air Force (IAF).

New Generation Akash missile

• Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) conducted a successful flight-test of the New Generation AKASH (AKASH-NG) missile from the Integrated Test Range (ITR), Chandipur off the coast

of Odisha.



About

- It is surface-to-air new generation missile.
- The missile intercepted the high-speed unmanned aerial vehicle at a very low altitude.
- The test has validated the functioning of the complete weapon system consisting of a missile with an indigenously developed radio frequency seeker, launcher, multifunction radar and command, control and communication system.
- This was the first trial of the missile against a live target, which was successfully intercepted and destroyed.





Rameshbabu Praggnanandhaa

- News- Rameshbabu Praggnanandhaa continued to script records as the chess prodigy became the No. 1-ranked Indian player for the first time in his career.
- Praggnanandhaa achieved the feat at the Tata Steel Masters in Wijk aan Zee, Netherlands, after defeating reigning world champion Ding Liren.

• News- Indian cricketer Virat Kohli just won the Puberty Athlete of the Year award, beating famous football player Lionel Messi. Even though Messi won another award recently, this time Kohli was the favourite.

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Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna award



- Chirag Shetty and Satwik Sai Raj Rankireddy won the Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna award announced by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports recently.
- The award will consist of the following:
- A cash amount of ₹25,00,000, exempt from income tax and wealth tax.
- A Certificate of Honour for each sportsperson.
- A medal for each sportsperson.

Sahitya Akademi Award

 Recently, Tamil author Rajasekaran (Devibharathi), Telugu writer T. Patanjali Sastry and Malayalam litterateur E.V. Ramakrishnan were among those named for the Sahitya Akademi Awards for the year 2023.

About

- It is awarded for the most outstanding books of literary merit published in any of the major Indian languages recognised by the Akademi.
- It was formally inaugurated by the Government of India on 12 March 1954.
- Sahitya Akademi, India's National Academy of Letters, is the central institution for literary dialogue, publication and promotion in the country and the only institution that undertakes literary activities in 24 Indian languages, including English.
- Though set up by the Government, the Akademi

functions as an autonomous organisation.

• It was registered as a society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860.

UNESCO Asia-Pacific Awards for Cultural Heritage Conservation

• Three heritage projects from Punjab and Haryana have secured prestigious spots among the UNESCO Asia-Pacific Awards for Cultural Heritage Conservation 2023.

Award winning sites from India are as follows

- The Rambagh Gate in Amritsar received the "Award of Excellence," the highest recognition among all categories.
- Pipal Haveli, a heritage rural homestay from Punjab was honoured for its sustainable development.
- The Karnikara Mandapam at Kunnamangalam Bhagawati Temple in Kerala earned the Award of Distinction.
- Epiphany in Haryana, David Sassoon Library and Reading Room in Mumbai and Bikaner House in New Delhi received the Award of Merit.

UNESCO's 2023 Prix Versailles.

- It is announced each year at UNESCO since 2015.
- The Prix Versailles awards celebrate outstanding achievements in architecture and design on a global scale.
- It focuses on intelligent sustainability as a cultural driver, acknowledging innovation, and creativity, reflection of local heritage, ecological efficiency, and values of social interaction.
- The Terminal 2 (T2) secured recognition as one of the 'World's most beautiful airports' and was awarded the coveted 'World special prize for an interior 2023.'

ANUBHAV Awards

• The submission deadline for ANUBHAV Awards Scheme 2024 is March 31, 2024.

About

- It recognizes the contribution made by Retired Officials to Nation building while working in Government and to document the administrative history of India by written narratives.

National Sports and Adventure Awards 2023

• The President of India presented the National Sports and Adventure Awards 2023 at a function in Rashtrapati Bhavan.

About

Categories of National Sports Award

- Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna Award: Considered India's highest sporting honour, the Khel Ratna was established in 1991-92. Named after the Indian hockey legend, Major Dhyan Chand.
- The award is given for outstanding performances in sports spanning over a period of four years.Khel Ratna winners receive a medallion, certificate and a cash prize.
- Arjuna Award: Awarded for consistent good performance over a period of four years. Winners of the Arjuna Award receive a statuette of Arjuna, a certificate and a cash prize.
- Dronacharya Award: Iinstituted in 1985, it

is India's highest sports honour for coaches. Awarded to individuals for producing medal winners at prestigious international events, awardees receive a bronze statue of Dronacharya, a certificate and a cash prize.

SAMAR Air Defence Missile System

• The Indian Air Force (IAF) has successfully test fired the 'SAMAR' air defence missile system recently.

About

- Surface to Air Missile for Assured Retaliation (SAMAR) is a short-range air-defence system.
- It has been developed by a unit under the IAF's Maintenance Command.
- The system is credited with a maximum range of 10–12 km and is used against low-flying aerial targets.
- It can engage aerial threats with missiles operating at a speed range of 2 to 2.5 Mach.
- The SAMAR-1 system uses the IAF's existing inventory of shelf-life-expired Russian Vympel R-73E infrared-guided air-to-air missiles (AAMs) for the surface-to-air role.



New Generation Akash missile

• Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) conducted a successful flight-test of the New Generation AKASH (AKASH-NG) missile from the Integrated Test Range (ITR), Chandipur off the coast of Odisha.

About

- It is a surface-to-air new generation missile.
- The missile intercepted the high-speed

unmanned aerial vehicle at a very low altitude.

- The test has validated the functioning of the complete weapon system consisting of a missile with an indigenously developed radio frequency seeker, launcher, multifunction radar and command, control and communication system.
- This was the first trial of the missile against a live target, which was successfully intercepted and destroyed.

Sea Dragon-24

 Indian Navy's P8I aircraft landed at Guam, a US island territory in Western Pacific, to participate in Exercise Sea Dragon – 24.



About

- It is an elite multinational maritime exercise that encourages professional exchanges and teamwork among participating navies.
- Participating countries: India, Japan, South Korea, Australia, and the US.

Ugram

• The Defence Research and Development Organisation recently launched an indigenous assault rifle named 'Ugram'.

About

- 'Ugram' is a state-of-the-art indigenous assault rifle.
- Developed by the Armament Research and

Development Establishment (ARDE), a unit of DRDO, in collaboration with a private industry partner.

- Developed in less than 100 days.
- Developed in consideration of the General Staff Qualitative Requirements (GSQR) of the army.

Exercise Ayutthaya

• The maiden Bilateral Maritime Exercise -Ayutthaya' between the Indian Navy (IN) and Royal Thai Navy (RTN) was conducted.




About

- The IndIa-Thailand Bilateral Exercise is being named as 'Ex-Ayutthaya', which literally translates to 'The Invincible One' or 'Undefeatable'.
- It symbolises the significance of two of the oldest cities Ayodhya in India and Ayutthaya in Thailand, the historic legacies, rich cultural ties and shared historical narratives dating back to several centuries.
- Indigenously built Indian Naval ships Kulish

Astra Missile

• The Minister of State for Defence recently flagged off the indigenously developed Astra Missiles for supply to the Indian Air Force (IAF) at Bharat Dynamics in Hyderabad.



About

- Astra is a beyond-visual-range (BVR) air-toair missile designed to be mounted on fighter aircraft.
- Indigenously developed by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and manufactured by Bharat Dynamics Ltd. (BDL) for the Indian Air Force (IAF).
- The missile is designed to engage and destroy highly manoeuvring supersonic aircraft.
- It is considered the best in its class of weapon systems in the world in the category of airto-air missiles.



Lentil Production

• India is set to become the world's largest producer of lentil (masoor) during the 2023-24 crop years on account of higher acreage.



About Lentils

- Lentils are rich in carbohydrates, protein, fat, fiber, folate, thiamine, vitamins, minerals, potassium, copper, zinc, iron, and other essential nutrients and used widely in the processing sector (unhusked seeds, split cotyledon dahl, savouries etc.).
- Lentil is the principal legume crop in the rice fallow belts of eastern India and also taken by farmers of central India. As per fourth advanced estimate from DES, MoAF&W, Govt. of India, 2022- Uttar Pradesh is the leading lentil producing state in India (0.47 million tonnes from 0.49 ha. acreage, 36.43 % of national production), followed by Madhya Pradesh (0.44 million tonnes from 0.49 million ha. acreage, 34.55% of national production), West Bengal (10.53%), Bihar (8.84%) and Jharkhand (4.50%) depending on their contribution in the national production of lentils.

India Tops Hong Kong as World's Fourth-Largest Stock Market



- India's stock market has surpassed Hong Kong's for the first time with the total value of shares listed on Indian exchanges reaching \$4.33 trillion as of Monday's close, exceeding Hong Kong's \$4.29 trillion, according to Bloomberg data. This makes India the world's fourthlargest equity market.
- The stock market capitalisation surpassed \$4 trillion on December 5, with about half of that coming in the past four years, the report added.
- 'Stable political environment and a consumption-driven economy'
- Indian equities are surging, fuelled by a growing base of retail investors and robust corporate earnings. India presents itself as a viable alternative to China, attracting global capital and companies due to its stable political environment and a consumption-driven economy among the fastest-growing globally, according to the report.
- Ashish Gupta, CIO at Axis Mutual Fund in Mumbai, expressed optimism, saying, "India has all the right ingredients in place to set the growth momentum further."



Leprosy

• The Odisha government recently declared leprosy a reportable disease in the state.

About

- Leprosy, also known as Hansen's disease, is a chronic infectious disease caused by a type of bacteria, Mycobacterium leprae.
- The disease predominantly affects the skin, the peripheral nerves, the mucosal surfaces of the upper respiratory tract, and the eyes.
- Left untreated, the disease may cause progressive and permanent disabilities.
- It is more common in tropical and subtropical areas.
- It is a neglected tropical disease (NTD)that still occurs in more than 120 countries.
- It is known to occur at all ages, ranging from early childhood to old age.

Classical Language

• The West Bengal Chief Minister urged the central government to include 'Bengali' as a classical language.

About

- Criteria evolved by Government of India to determine declaration of a language as a Classical language is as under: -
- High antiquity of its early texts/recorded history over a period of 1500-2000 years;

Pravasi Bharatiya Diwas

- It is also known as Non-Resident Indian (NRI) Day, is celebrated on January 9 to mark the contribution and achievements of the overseas Indian community to the development of India.
- It is the flagship event of the Ministry of External Affairs.
- The day also commemorates the return of Mahatma Gandhi, the greatest Pravasi, from South Africa to India in 1915, who led India's freedom struggle and changed the lives of Indians forever.
- It was first celebrated in 2003. It was an annual event earlier, but in 2015, the government revised its format to celebrate PBD once every two years.

Japan's Moon Mission - SLIM

• Japan recently landed a spacecraft called SLIM (Smart Lander for Investigating Moon) on the lunar surface, becoming the 5th country after the Soviet Union, the US, China and India to achieve a soft landing on the moon.

About

- SLIM was launched by the Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (JAXA) in September 2023 aboard the H-IIA rocket from the Tanegashima spaceport.
- It aims to demonstrate precision landing within 100 metres through new technologies.

About

- Vadnagar is a town and municipality in the Mehsana district of North Gujarat.
- As a historical city, it was known by various names, such as Vridhanagar, Anandapur, Anartapur, and Nagar.
- The town represents a continuously evolving historic urban landscape/area that played a major role in the hinterland trade network of Western India.
- It is mentioned often in the Puranas and even in the travelogue of the great Chinese traveller, Hieu-en-Tsang (7th century), as a rich and flourishing town.

Farsi(Persian)

• The External Affairs Minister recently announced that the Government of India has decided to include Farsi (Persian) as one of the classical languages in India under the New Education Policy.

About

• Farsi, also known as Persian Language, is the most widely spoken member of the Iranian branch of the Indo-Iranian languages, a

subfamily of the Indo-European languages.

• It is the official language of Iran, and two varieties of Persian known as Dari and Tajik are official languages in Afghanistan and Tajikistan, respectively.
